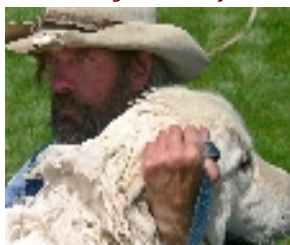

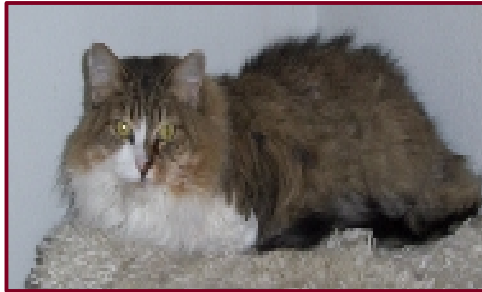

One of the biggest dangers to dogs in cars is becoming overheated when left in a parked car. Even with the windows cracked open, and being parked in the shade, a car can quickly heat up and be a death trap for the dog in minutes. A car parked in the sun can heat by as much as 20 degrees (Fahrenheit) in less than half an hour, and will continue to warm. Make no mistake dogs have died in cars where the outside temperatures are in the low 80's. A contributing factor is that occasionally the owner is away from the car longer than they expected. Are you really doing your dog a favor by allowing him to ride along? You are the leader of the pack and your pet believes you have the mental capacity to make the right decision to keep him/her safe!

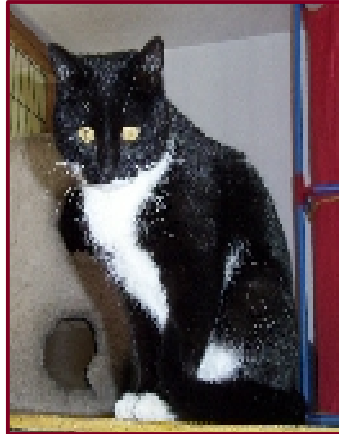

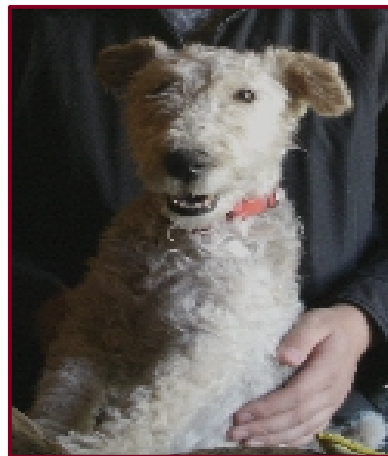

From the President's Desk

Hello and thanks again from the Western Fremont County Humane Society!

Summer is here and we are gearing up for another season of events and fund-raising. Thanks to all for making our annual "Strutt Your Mutt" Dog Fun Day in the park and our first two dog washes at the Dubois Library such a great success. Join us on August 28th for our final dog wash of the season. Stayed tuned for news on fun events in the planning. WFCHS wants to remind everyone that we are still sponsoring the year-round Discount Spay & Neuter program to help prevent unwanted litters and prolong the health of your pets. 2009 was another busy year at our shelters: we took in over 30 cats and kittens and around 10 dogs. All critters were either adopted out or returned to searching owners.

We are still encouraging land owners to spay or neuter feral and barn cats on their property to prevent the overwhelming number of kittens born each year. We are happy to assist financially where we can and lend out live traps. WFCHS also stresses the importance of feeding these wild cats and making sure there is a source of water nearby in order to keep them healthy and where you want them.

The town of Dubois is still without an animal control officer and we ask again that you direct concerns about dogs at-large or abuse or nuisance animals to the Town Hall or the Fremont County Sheriff's Department. WFCHS is not animal control enforcement ... we are here to assist animals in need. We would like to remind folks to keep their pets vaccinated and licensed. The Annual Discount Vaccination Clinic is held the on the second Saturday in August falling on August 14th this year.

Once again, thank you to all who have supported us so generously over the years through financial donations, supplies, fostering and help at events. We couldn't do it without our wonderful, caring town!

WFCHS Christmas Tree for 2009



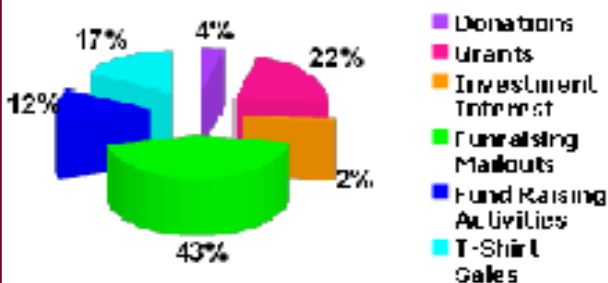

Thank you Bob and Joyce Hazard for buying our tree and thank you all for making it a Success!

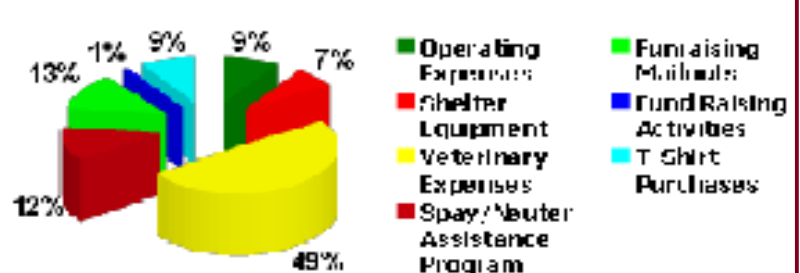

Sources of Funds \$10,853



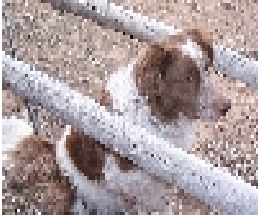
